#### Academic Full Credit

Full Credit courses are rigorous courses, designed for school-age students who wish to earn credits towards graduation, to improve the mark of a previously taken course, or to satisfy post-secondary entrance requirements. Student attendance is crucial. Final grades of successfully completed full credit courses will be reflected on student transcripts.



Students will prepare themselves for the upcoming school year by choosing to preview courses in the areas of Business Ed, English Language Arts, Math, Science, Socials, Jazz Band and Physical Education. These non-credit courses will cover some of the Core Big Competencies. Ideas and Curricular with Competencies along indigenous perspectives and knowledge, through learnercentred and engaging activities. They will NOT cover the entire scope of a full course.

#### **Academic Completion**

Academic Completion courses are for Grades 10 and 11 students who received a letter grade "I" (incomplete) or "F", or a course mark between 35%-49%. Courses will focus on key big ideas and competencies and will NOT cover the entire scope of a full course. The maximum grade that a student can achieve upon completion is C-.
